Meeting will cover the anticipated projects for 2009/2010. We have a draft list of projects submitted by members and have made one pass at them. Now, we will finalize the project list. We will also discuss the anticipated fund raising needed for 2010 to continue to keep the Foundation budget in good shape.

**Vocational Scholarship Committee is Organized** – Our scholarship committee includes Ann Trevisan, Bob Bielski, Rick Hynes, and Stan Krangel. Ann has prepared all the necessary paperwork for seniors in our West Chester District. This \$3,000 scholarship is directed toward those seeking a vocational career and who have demonstrated community service in their high school years.

**Speaker On Thursday** – President Jeff will introduce our speaker, Mary Anne Feeley. Mary Anne is a representative of United Way. Her topic is **Born Learning Trails**. Our speaker on February 4 will be Aldo Magazenni from Traveling Mercies.

**Reasons to Support the Rotary Foundation** – The five top reasons We-Go members should financially support the RI Foundation are the following: Eradication of polio, Giving the world hope, Promoting peace and conflict resolution, reducing child mortality, and Fighting hunger. **Speaker on January 14** – Our speaker on the 14th was Patric Parris, a teacher with the Pennsylvania Leadership Charter School. This school is a satellite cyber education site in which civic leadership and career direction is the principal theme. The Congress of the United States has provided the funding for this pioneer program. These students have been instructed in the Spanish language, and they have experienced, via a trip to Panama, native villagers who cannot speak Spanish. The American students provided a method of translation from their native tongue to Spanish to English. The cultural experience was very rewarding.

**Speaker on January 21** – Last week on Thursday evening our speaker was Aylssa Conaway from West Chester University. Alyssa is a senior student in the University Honors Program; she came with a female freshman honors student. We-Go was informed about the Fifth Annual Community Fair to be held on April 11 from noon to 6 p.m. at the Hollinger Field House. The fair is a fund raiser to support a food program in South Africa that feeds orphan children of aids victims. The fair is open to the general public and there

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is no entrance fee. There will be games and fun for all. We-Go has supported the Aid to South Africa project. Donations are welcomed.

Proceeds from this event benefit two South African organizations: the H. E. L. P. Ministries soup kitchen, that feeds 6,000 people daily; and Sparrow Village, that adopts, supports, and cares for HIV-positive children.
